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Agent v1

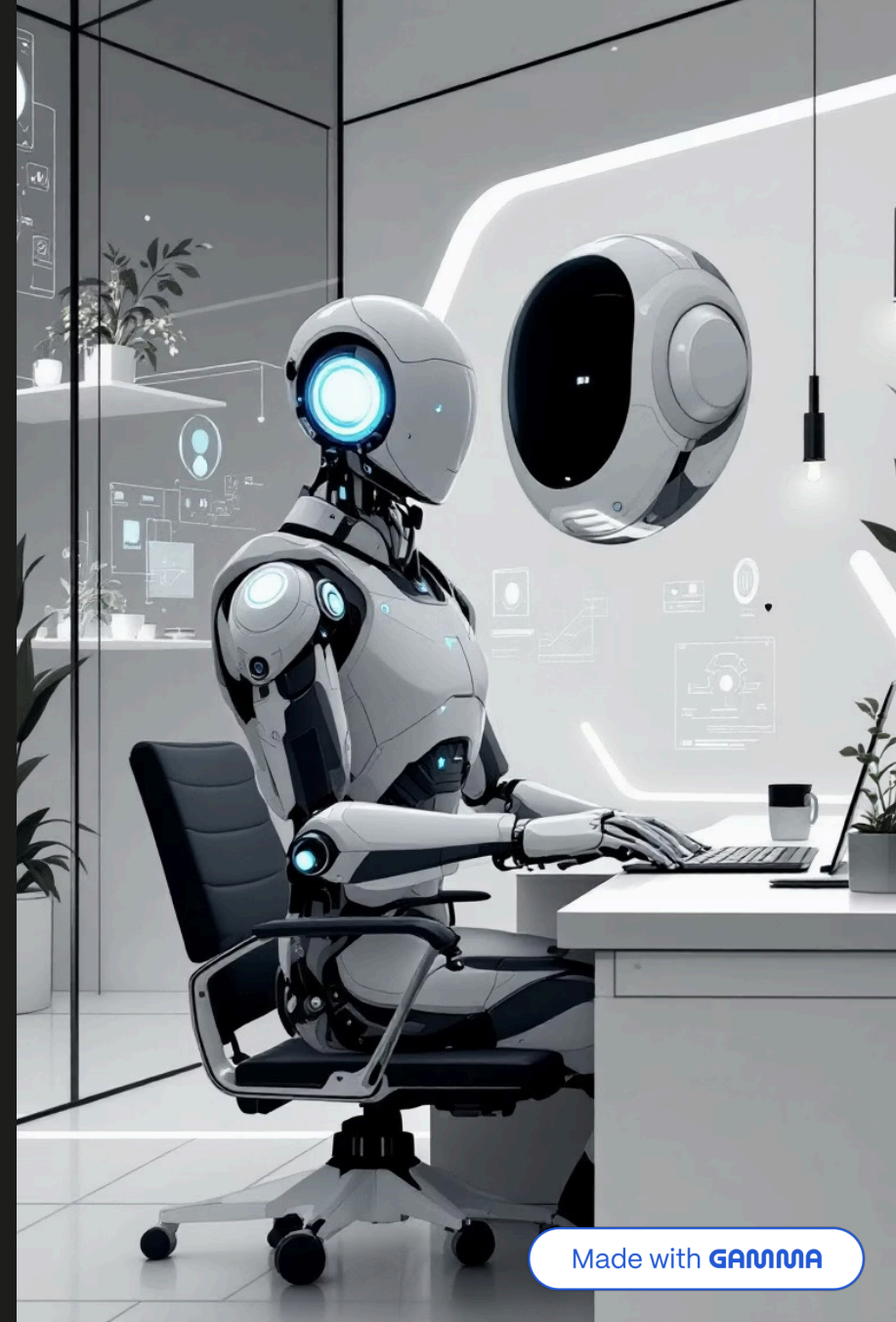
"I know everything. Unfortunately."

Operations unplug things
